## Laws of the Land

- Conserve Electricity – we are on SOLAR
- Stay within our property boundaries (map)
- Respect the House, and each other
- Be responsible for yourself and your belongings

- Put away food right after use
- No food or drinks in the Pods except water bottles
- No sodas left anywhere
- Take out garbage before it overflows
- Always plan on leaving things **better** than you found them
- Be kind and appreciative

## Before Your Trip

### Helpful Planning Information

- Maximum total group size= 30
- Ideal group size 25
- Minimum group size 15
- There are six separate living areas called Pods
- Each Pod sleeps 5 and has its own bathroom and shower. Mattresses provided.
- Each Pod must have Adequate supervision [1 adult per 4 kids]
- There is a washer and dryer on the property, but do not plan on using it unless we have unusually wet conditions. (See the section on SOLAR power...)
- All garbage to be removed from property at the end of your stay. Please plan accordingly.

### Important Property Information

- House is solar powered and electrical energy conservation is a high priority
- Kid's House is on 130 Acres
- We are a working ranch with Sheep, Donkeys, Horses, and milking Cows. If you wish to see the animals please arrange with one of our staff so they can take you to see the animals.
- There are different designated areas to play large group games, plan game locations with our staff.
- We encourage kids to ask lots of questions and fall in love with the farm. We want to consider all who come here as part of our extended family.
- Sound room ideal for acoustic or miking instruments, but no excessive loud instruments.

## Location/Directions

Do not put signs outside property or on gate. Please note we are not allowed to put signs up outside the property or on the gate, so it is important to use the directions that we give. Please see the separate page for directions. Do not use any other directions, ever.

**NOTE:** IT IS VERY IMPORTANT THAT **NOBODY** GETS ONTO THE PROPERTY USING **ANY** OTHER DIRECTIONS, USE **ONLY** THAT PAGE. PLEASE DO NOT GIVE OUT A SUMMARY OF THE DIRECTIONS, AND PLEASE TELL EVERYONE WHO GETS DIRECTIONS FROM YOU THAT THEY MUST **NOT** GIVE OUT THEIR OWN DIRECTIONS!!

## Practical Suggestions / Additional "What to Bring"

- Buy a couple cases of decent water bottles (The kind with push down spouts) to assign everybody right when they get here. Put their names on them and use them at meal times rather than wash or throw out a lot of cups each meal.
- Bring: Extra Notebook/Pens/Pencils, Extra Bibles, Board Games, First Aid Kit, Bug spray, extra DVD's incase of rain.
- For Kitchen, bring: napkins, paper towels, tall kitchen trash can liners, and dish towels.
- For each Pod bring: Liquid or foam hand soap, napkins or paper towels.
- As a group you might want to bring an inexpensive shampoo and conditioner for each pod so all 30 kids do not have to bring it individually.
- You will be amazed how much more fun you will have and how much more pleasant your group will be if you limit any source of caffeinated drink and completely prohibit any high caffeine 'energy" drink.
- Cell phones can be a distraction to learning and paying attention. However, often they are also used as cameras. Try to come up with a policy that works for your group, that limits cell phone use and texting. Often, groups choose to keep phones in a 'basket' except for certain times and occasions.
